History

French Breakfast Radish is an heirloom variety of radish that was introduced in the late 1800s and became popular in Paris produce markets.

Fun Fact

Radish are a part of the *Brassicaceae* (mustard or cabbage) plant family. That means they're related to kale, broccoli, and turnips!



Growing and Harvest



- The part of the radish that you eat grows below the ground. The leaves aren't edible (by humans, but rabbits love them!) and they grow above ground.
- You can grow a French Breakfast radish from seed in just 25 days in both the spring and fall!

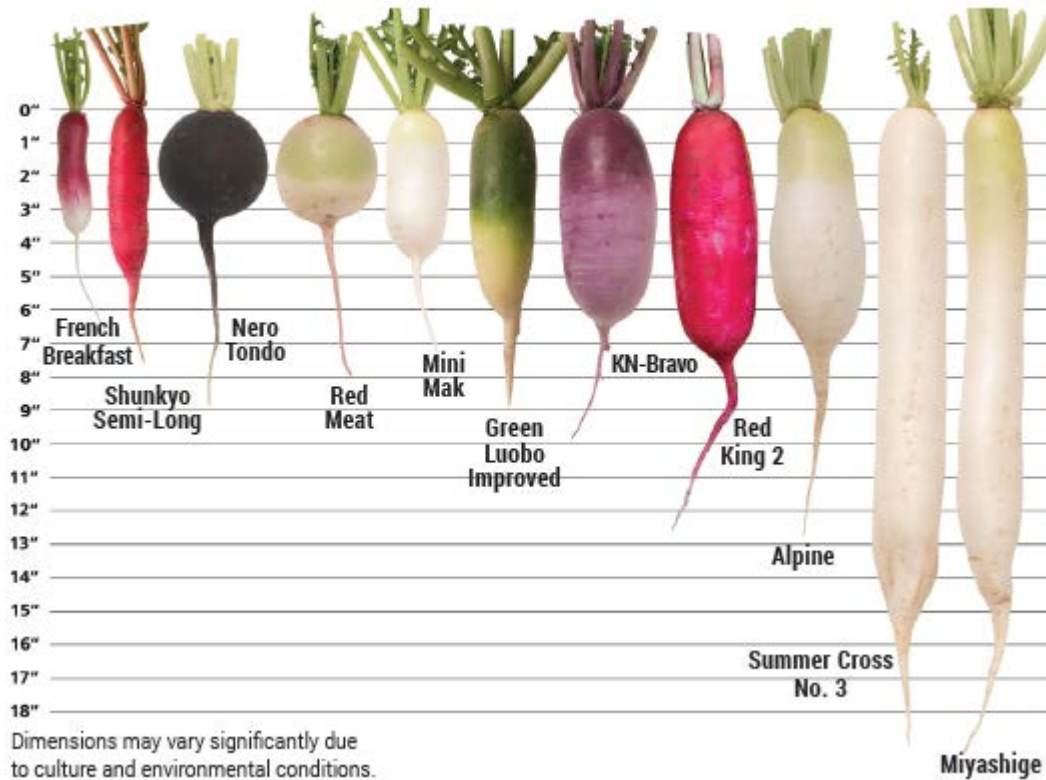
